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NAUTICAL TURISM IN CROATIA

Capacity and Turnover of Ports, 2015

- 121 nautical ports (anchorage, moorings, land marinas and marinas) on the Croatian coast

(The categorisation is carried out on the basis of the Law on Tourism Services Act and the Ordinance on Classification and Categorisation of Nautical Ports)

- 70 marinas (of which 13 land marinas)

- 51 other nautical ports

The total water surface area 3 614 784 m²

total income realised in nautical ports in 2015 amounted to 753 million kuna (as compared to 2014, the total income increased by 5.1%).

Prevention standards

- **Maritime Domain and Seaport Act (Art.83-85, Order in Port)**
- **Decree on Conditions that must be met by Ports (Art.3/6/7/8)**

Duties of **concession holders** of special purpose ports:

- to equip the port with reception facilities for handling and collecting solid and liquid waste as defined by the provisions of MARPOL 73/78
- to prepare **Rules of Order in the Port** – confirmed by authorized harbour master's office
- location plans, published on a notice board, of reception facilities with the description of the type of waste from ships that can be accepted,
- ensured sea pollution prevention devices and equipment, and devices and equipment for the removal of the results of the pollution of the sea

INSPECTION CONTROL – competent harbour master's officer

- **Maritime Code** (Part 3, Ports and other Parts of Internal Waters, Art. 56a/56c)

- **Regulation on the Conditions and Methods of Establishing Order in the Ports and in the other Parts of the Internal Sea Waters and Territorial Sea of the Republic of Croatia (Art.2 and 3, art.62 – Reporting and Accepting Waste)**

Duties of concession holders of special purpose ports:

- to provide adequate equipment and facilities for handling and acceptance of solid and liquid waste as defined in MARPOL 73/7

- to prepare and implement the plan for acceptance and handling of waste approved by the harbourmaster's office for a period not longer than three years

- to prepare **Rules of Order in the Port** – confirmed by authorized harbour master's office

INSPECTION CONTROL – competent harbour master's officer

- Rules of Order in the MARINA.....(each marina adopted)

Control of the application of the RULES is performed by the management board or by person authorized to act on their behalf – non-compliance – marina is authorized to **cease providing its service** and to **charge potential damage** to the responsible user

Supervision of the implementation of ORDER in the port is performed by competent harbour master's office – **non-compliance** – **offence** – will be charged by the harbour master's office

Preservation of environment

- waste oil and filters, residues from detergents, utility waste and other forms of waste must be disposed, according to the waste type, in environmentally –friendly containers located in marina

In the event of significant pollution, the Marina will:

- determine the cause,
- take measures for the prevention of the environment,
- notify the competent authority,
- charge responsible user for any costs incurred.

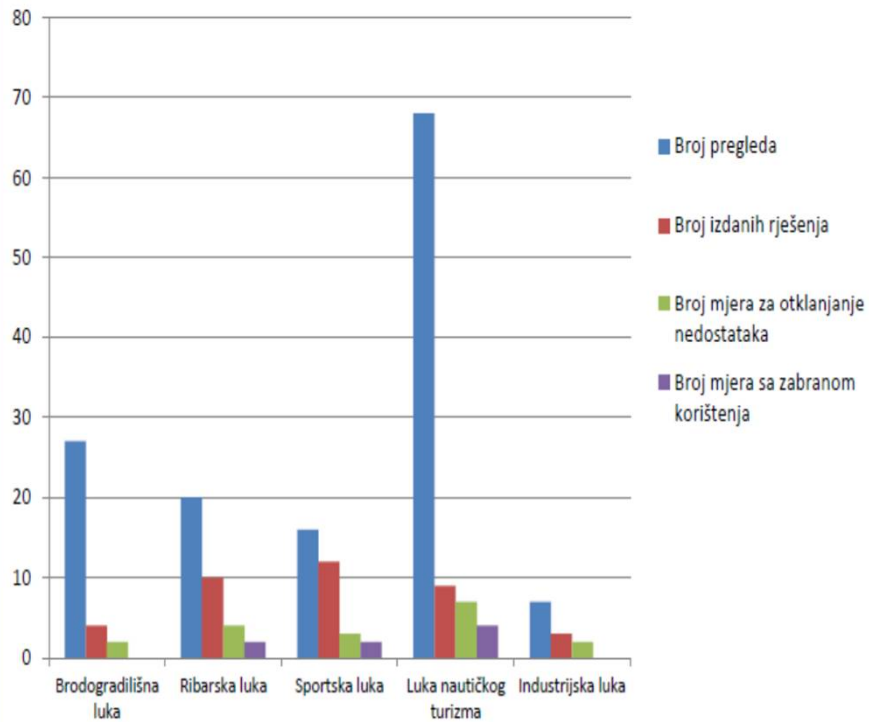
